Thank you to those who attended our coffee morning on Friday. It was lovely to chat with you all. You were all so incredibly kind, recognising the hard work of

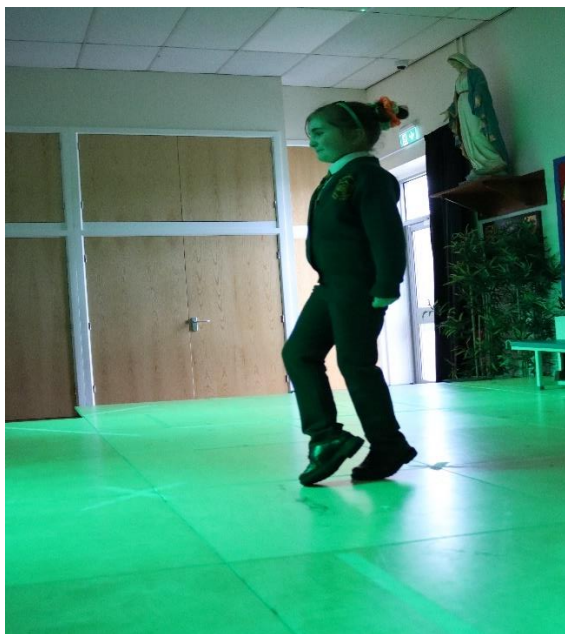

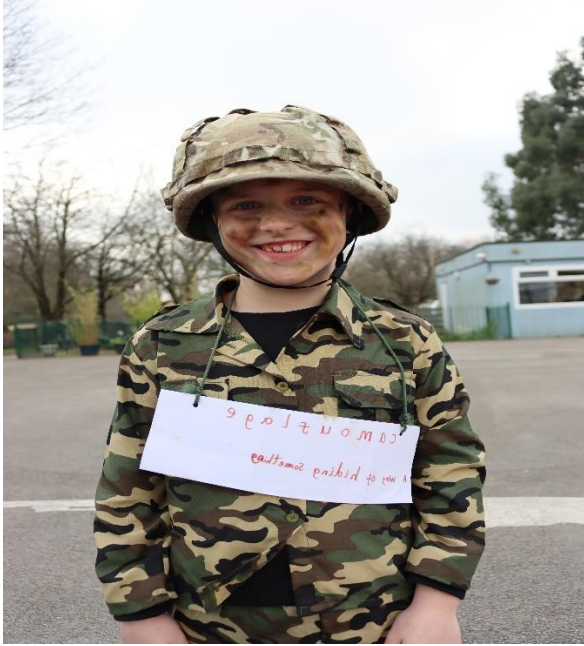
