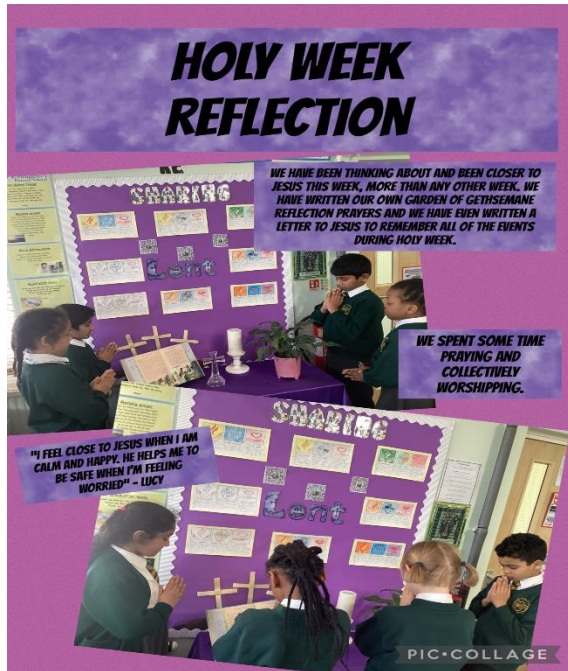

Nursery

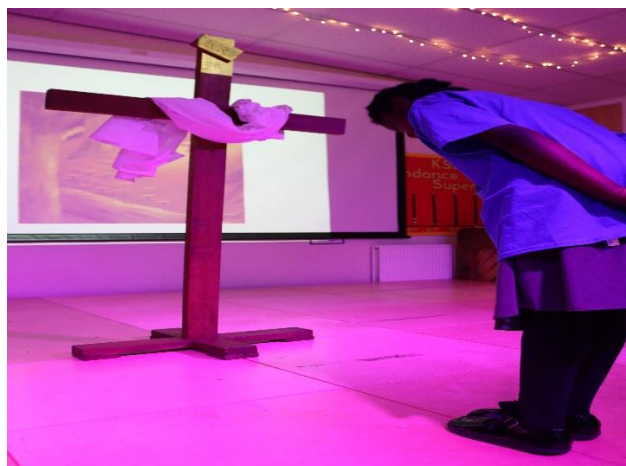
