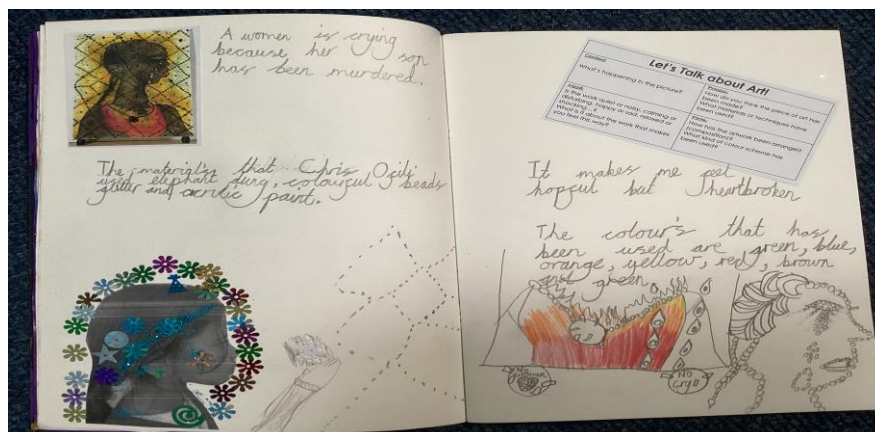
Celebrating Black History Month

Year 3 have explored the artwork 'No Woman No Cry' by Chris Ofili. This was one of the works included in the exhibition which won him the Turner Prize that year. The Financial Times described it as "his masterpiece." Chris Ofili was born in Manchester to parents May and Michael Ofili of Nigerian descent. Chris Ofili was for some years educated at St. Pius X High School for Boys, and then at Xaverian College in Victoria Park, Manchester. Since 2005 he has been living and working in Trinidad and Tobago.

Alma Woodsey Thomas was an African-American artist and teacher who lived and worked in Washington, D.C. and is now recognised as a major American painter of the 20th century.
